TikTok

I need to share with you a safeguarding concern that I have been alerted to. Police are seriously concerned about the current TikTok trend that is being circulated between young people. The account is stating that Saturday is a 'national sexual assault and rape day'

We are sharing this information with you and ask that you discuss this with your child if needed, firstly to reassure them this is a hoax but also to encourage them to speak to you if they have any concerns or related information whilst making sure they are not involved in sharing the rumour further.

There is no evidence that supports the existence of the group. However, the matter is being very closely monitored, and if evidence emerges, the police and partners will respond strongly.
