School Covid-19 Information

We would like to take this opportunity to remind parents of a few key points of information relating to the ongoing pandemic. This week local schools have had to close bubbles of children due to positive cases of Covid-19. The virus is still out there and we must continue to take all necessary steps to prevent infection in our school.

Most importantly, we still need parents to book a PCR test for their child if they are showing symptoms We will send children home (to have a test) if they develop symptoms in school. Any child with a continuous cough, high temperature or a loss/change to their sense of taste/smell is required to take a **PCR test**.

Some parents have opted to carry out an LFD test rather than a PCR. An LFD test is only for asymptomatic testing and not for someone with symptoms. By taking an LFD test, this only delays the child returning to school as we cannot accept them back until we have proof of a **negative PCR test**.

If parents refuse to test their child when they are displaying symptoms, the whole household must isolate for 10 days instead. Parents must wait for a negative result from their PCR test or 10 days before sending their child back to school.

We ask for parents continued support in following the Government's guidance on testing and whilst we appreciate it is frustrating for parents when you think your child may just have a cold or hay fever, we cannot guarantee this is the case and must take the necessary precautions.
